

India's Roadmap from Rote Learning to Holistic Learning

The school educational system of today's India is trying its best to scrap the 'factory model' that remained in vogue ever since the pre-independent 18th and 19th century era. That model might have suited the times of Industrial Revolution, but today there is a different world out here. In the last two decades, there have been dramatic changes in the overall social environment of India and lifestyle of the common Indian. Our education must reflect that change. Old techniques and systems must give way for fresh approaches.

We have all tried repetition as a learning technique. The idea is that the more we are exposed to repetition of some material, the deeper it will sink in. However, this approach often has disappointing results. This technique is a really bad one when applied to a composition or an essay or a literature answer. And that same technique becomes almost evil when we try to cram up the steps of solving a particular mathematical problem. You get my point, don't you?

When you simply memorize or learn something through rote, you are not really trying to understand its deeper meaning, you are overlooking how it works and you are ignoring the mechanics and the logic at work. So you may retain a photocopy of that knowledge in your brain cells and replicate it on a piece of paper, but you will never be able to transfer that knowledge into real-life application.

On the other end of the spectrum, there is holistic or meaningful learning. In this system of education, you will not simply retain knowledge in your memory cells, you will rather understand how things work. So the key to meaningful learning is "understanding" rather than "memorizing". What you will acquire through this process will be true knowledge, something that will stay with you forever and will make you an empowered citizen.

This is the new direction that our modern education system has embraced and now promotes. If you don't start travelling the same path, you will be stranded. So, let's start walking before it is too late.




THE NIGHT BEFORE THE EXAMINATION





SCIENTIFIC, AMAZING & FUNNY FACTS

- Cats respond most readily to names that end in an "ee" sound.
- It is estimated that cats can make over 60 different sounds.
- A cat can spend 5 or more hours a day in grooming itself.
- Cats sleep for about 16-18 hours. They are very lazy.
- The world's longest word is 'Pneumonoultramicroscopicsilicovolcanocosis'. It is the name of a fatal lung disease in which the lungs are inflamed due to inhalation of volcanic ashes.
- If you see an animal with two or more heads, don't get surprised. This phenomenon is known as 'polycephaly' in which a zygote fails to divide into two and the division is incomplete, whereas the other parts grow properly. This incomplete division is later seen in the form of an abnormality of having two or more heads.
- If you cut a block of gold at a scale of 15 nm (nanometer), then you will obtain a green liquid. If you cut it at a scale of 20nm, you will obtain a red liquid. This phenomenon occurs because any chemical element on being cut in a nanoscale changes its physical & chemical properties and gets some unexpected properties.
